TEAMS

Teams will consist of a maximum of 4 riders. i.e. a team may be made up of 2 to 4 riders. Team members must represent the school they are currently attending or a school they are eligible to attend for their secondary education. If entering a composite team the team may be made up of riders from 3 different primary schools but only one secondary school. Each team must have an Adult Team Manager. The Team Manager is responsible for their team during the competition. Team members may enter up to 8 classes. Cost is \$8 per class. All competition disciplines must be covered by the team members i.e. at least one member of the team must attempt each discipline.

UNIFORMS

Team members are to wear the uniform of the school they currently attend. Uniform is to consist of a polo shirt or a rugby top or a shirt & tie with a jumper over jodhpurs.

COMPETITION NUMBERS & ARMBANDS

All competitors must provide their own numbers- bridle numbers, saddle cloth numbers or number holders.

All competitors must wear medical armbands.

GEAR CHECK

Gear check for all riders prior to competing. All riders must wear complying helmets. Spot checks to ensure compliance may occur. Elimination will apply for incorrect helmet standard numbers. PCAV Gear Rules (February 2012)

LUNGEING

As per PCAV Handbook of Bylaws February 1st 2012: **Lungeing may only take place in a confined area designated exclusively for lungeing.**

Only the competitor may ride or lunge his/her horse or pony on competition day. The penalty for disobeying this rule is elimination

SHOW JUMPING AND DRESSAGE

Open to P.C.A.V and H.R.C.A.V members only. **H.R.C.A.V. members please include a photocopy of current card and grading with entry form. P.C.A.V members to present cards at gear check**

GAMES

1. This is a timed event
2. Knocking of a bending pole will incur a 5 second penalty. Missing a pole without rectifying course will incur elimination- taking the wrong track elimination
3. Knocking a hurdle in the OEH will incur a 5 point penalty. Going outside the hurdles=elimination
4. If a flag is knocked over it must be stood up before continuing the course. If a flag falls out of the drum it must be picked up and put in from the horse (not from the ground) before continuing the course.
5. Course to be ridden in the following order
 - rider to commence at the bending race
 - On completion go straight to the old English hunt, then onto modified flag (4 flags).
 - After putting the last flag into the drum the rider dismounts and runs, leading the horse, over the stepping stones to the finish.

Table A2 (Article 238 2.1) Competitions against the clock

2.1. Riders with equality of penalties for any place are placed in accordance with the time taken to complete the round. In the event of equality of penalties and time for first place, there may be a jump-off over a shortened course over obstacles, which may be increased in height and/or spread in accordance with the provisions of the schedule.

Class 2 - Two Phase. (Article 274.5.2)

This competition comprises two phases run without interruption, each at an identical or different speed, the finishing line for the first phase being identical with the starting line for the second phase.

The first phase is a course of 7 to 9 obstacles with or without combinations. The second phase takes place over 4 to 6 obstacles, which may include one combination.

Riders penalised in the first phase are halted by ringing the bell after they have jumped the last obstacle or when the time allowed for the first phase has been exceeded, after crossing the finishing line of the first phase. They must stop after crossing the first finishing line. Riders not penalised in the first phase continue the course, which finishes, after crossing the second finishing line.

The manner of judging this competition must be specified in the schedule in accordance with the following formula:
